THE ROUNDS

PORTSMOUTH 5 doz arrows at a 60cm face over 20 yards, only 10s count as golds, this may be shot indoors or outside.
Compound bows must shoot inner tens.

FROSTBITE 3 doz arrows at a 80cm face over 30 metres, only 10s count as golds, this round must be shot out of doors.

MONTHLY SCORES

Should be sent using the attached form to the Organiser during the first week of the succeeding month.

If an archer was unable to record a score, the result sheet should still be returned to the organiser indicating a no score.

Any scores not received in reasonable time will be considered as 'No Score'.

RESULTS

Monthly progressive results will be sent to all Pairs and a complete list publicised at half-way and at the end-of-season in the Ascham News. Two points will be given for a win each month and a bonus point added for the highest score in each Division. In addition, a Handicap Shoot will be run on the rounds shot in March for both Portsmouth and Frostbite rounds.

AWARDS

Each winning pair will be presented with two C.S.A.A. spoons indicating the round and Division in which they were competing. Awards for compound bow pairs (or mixed pairs) and longbow pairs will be dependent upon there being sufficient entries. Additionally, the highest scores in each round for the whole season will receive the Perpetual Trophies.

ENTRY FEE

£5 per pair per round to be sent with the November scores. This payment covers all five months of the contest.

ELIGIBILITY

At least one archer in each pair must be either :-

- a) a member of the Civil Service Sports Council (C.S.S.C.), Northern Ireland Civil Service Sports Association (N.I.C.S.S.A.), the Civil Service Archery Association (C.S.A.A.) or the Post Office Recreation Club (P.O.R.C.), or
- b) the spouse of a member of the CSSC, NICSSA, CSAA or PORC and him/herself a member of the CSAA, or
- c) a serving member of the Armed Forces or the British Police, and a member of their Archery Association, or
- d) the spouse of a serving member of the Armed Forces or the British Police and a member of the specific Archery Association.

The other archer in the pair need only be of amateur status and a member of the Grand National Archery Society.

EQUIPMENT

Class 1 - compound bows, limited or unlimited.

Class 2 - composite bows and simple (fibreglass) bows.

Class 3 - longbows

NB If a pair has a bow from one Class and one from another Class, then the pair will be considered as the higher Class, e.g., a compound and a recurve will be considered as Class 1.

In the event that there are insufficient longbow pairs, i.e., less than 4 pairs, those wishing to compete will be placed within the recurve leagues.
